A Level Accounting

Overview

This program assists students in applying prior accounting concepts in order to analyse and present data. Students and their mentor will focus on developing the skills required to develop and communicate justified explanations, judgements and recommendations. This program will cover topics such as recording financial information, accounting principles, control systems and preparation of final accounts in an effort to expand student knowledge and understanding of the intricacies of accounting. Finally, students will develop an understanding of raising capital by shares and loans, along with preparation of cash flow statements, cash flow analysis and investment appraisal.

Objectives

- Develop an ability to apply accounting concepts, principles and practices.
- Understand the role of accounting for monitoring, problem-solving and decision making
- Develop a critical and analytical reasoning while examining and evaluating accounting policies and practices
- Develop skills of analysis and interpretation of accounting data
