AT Economics: Globalisation

Overview

This college level program is designed to offer students an opportunity to delve deeper into the international economy. The focus of the course is globalisation with a particular interest in international trade and economic development. Students will work with a mentor to identify and make use of the conventional models learned in previous economics classes, as well as the less conventional models of behavioural economics to study economic development and growth around the world. All students will write a research paper and work on a development problem with a local social enterprise as culminating economics project.

Objectives

- Master a broad body of economic knowledge
- Apply economic principles to a variety of real-world situations
- Develop appropriate logical and mathematical skills to construct and analyse economic graphs
- Effectively collaborate to solve problems and further develop economic skills
