Overview

Students who choose to participate in this program will gain a better understanding of how we become who we are, garnering a greater appreciation of individual, social, and cultural diversity. As students work closely with a mentor, they will develop their knowledge of aspects of social, economic, and political structures and processes. Key to this program is that students will investigate case studies and sociological research. This will allow students to analyse human behaviour within society, between cultures and across periods, enhancing their critical thinking and evaluative skills.

Objectives

- Promote awareness of the role of continuity and change in social life
- Understanding how we become who we are
- Enhance critical thinking and analysis while interpreting data
- Acquire knowledge and understanding of social, economic, and political structures
